Our Principles

To be financially accountable: We strive to respect the privacy of all who donate funds to assist with the preservation of the materials, and to ensure that all donated funds are directed towards this purpose.

We aim to make ethical decisions concerning the accessibility of the Halliday & Hasan Archive where possible and where this does not impinge on the privacy of family and colleagues.

To provide an inclusive platform for all scholars: We aim to provide an inclusive digital platform for scholars to freely access the archive.

To expand the development of linguistic theories through engagement with the Halliday & Hasan Archive: We commit to consultation with all partners within the linguistics community and to motivate others to participate in our vision.
